Abortionist Gosnell sentenced to life in prison

By agreeing not to appeal his conviction, Gosnell avoided the death penalty for three convictions of first-degree murder

PHILADELPHIA — Following his conviction for the murder of three babies born alive, abortionist Kermit Gosnell received two life sentences without parole for two of those murder charges. He also was found guilty of involuntary manslaughter in the death of patient Karnamaya Mongar, who died after a botched abortion. In addition, he was found guilty on most of the more than 200 counts of violating Pennsylvania's informed consent law.

Gosnell agreed to waive all of his appellate rights in exchange for life in prison instead of the death penalty, said the office of R. Seth Williams, Philadelphia's district attorney, May 14. He was immediately sentenced.

Nine of his employees have faced state and federal charges for their actions at the business. Eight have pleaded guilty to various charges in the case — three of them to third-degree murder.

Former employee Stephen Massof, in courtroom testimony in early April, said he saw about 100 babies born alive. He said workers then "snipped" the backs of their necks to ensure their "demise." He is in prison after pleading guilty to third-degree murder in the deaths of two newborns.

In a January 2011 grand jury report, Williams found that the Pennsylvania Department of Health had contact with Gosnell's

clinic in 1979, when it approved it. The department did not conduct another site review until 1989, finding "numerous violations." Two site reviews found more violations in 1992 and 1993 but failed to make corrections.

Gosnell's name became a rallying cry for pro-life advocates,

who lamented a lack of major media coverage of his trial. Their efforts on social media helped draw attention to the case.

In a 2002 study, 39 percent of prison inmates came from fatherless homes. The role of father is frequently demeaned as the buffoon or the punch line of a joke. However, statistics demonstrate the negative impact the lack of a father can have on a family.

Please reach out when you see a dad playing with the kids or persevering through a hardship to provide for his family and say thank you. He is protecting and providing for his family and giving them the best opportunity for success. As it relates specifically to abortion, it is natural for a father to protect his child. When an abortion occurs, it is in direct conflict to this natural law. Please pray for reconciliation for the fathers as they need forgiveness and healing for their role in an abortion.

Plan B, or the morning-after pill, is an emergency contraceptive that is now available on the shelves of all drug stores to all girls regardless of age. This is an extremely dangerous decision for our young girls. The FDA had been fighting to keep an age limit on the availability of this drug but recently backed down. This is another step toward fulfilling the strategy of getting our daughters into a sexually active lifestyle. The strategy is as follows: Promote "protected sex" and condom use. This increases the number of sexual encounters. This increases the need for abortions. They continue to disconnect the consequences of sexual activity through abortion and the morning-after pills.

The Kermit Gosnell story is a gruesome example of how wrong things can

get when a society no longer protects the sanctity of human life. I recently heard the jurors of this trial were offered extensive counseling due to the gruesomeness of the three-week testimony. Planned Parenthood of the Heartland still has its sights set on expanding into six outstate Nebraska communities, but organized pro-life efforts in each city will hold them at bay, according to Nebraska Right to Life.

"Planned Parenthood of the Heartland has been trying to raise money for two years to potentially open sites in Fremont, Grand Island, Hastings, Kearney, Norfolk and North Platte," said Julie Schmit-Albin, Nebraska Right to Life executive director. "Fortunately, pro-lifers started organizing two years ago to specifically shut Planned Parenthood out of their cities. Grassroots activists have gathered thousands of petition names in each city to present to their local elected officials as a show of support in keeping Planned Parenthood out.

"In addition, speakers knowledgeable about how Planned Parenthood operates have toured all of the cities, and several cities continue to hold specific gatherings aimed at educating the public on Planned Parenthood," she said. "If Planned Parenthood opens a facility in one or more

of these cities, the resistance will remain strong, as it has in Omaha

Saving lives, helping mothers

Lincoln Planned Parenthood began advertising a couple weeks ago for a new clinic manager and security guard. About two months ago, one of the two security guards quit, telling a Helper counselor he could no longer work at a place that did such evil. The Helpers have been praying for him since, and we learned that he has found another respectable job. Shortly after his departure, we learned that Anne,

a long-time employee/manager, had left. It recently was reported in the Lincoln Journal that CEO Jill June is retiring.

Three weeks ago, a mother came out of the clinic with her pregnant daughter and said she was not going to have an abortion. The woman had tears streaming down her face and thanked the people who had been praying at the clinic. The daughter said she couldn't contemplate abortion any longer when she heard the clinic worker refer to her baby in the womb as "him." These people were from Grand Island.

The mother and daughter told Helper counselors that the Planned Parenthood staff would not allow the girl's mother in the room when they did the ultrasound. The staff dissuaded the girl from looking at her sonogram, saying something like, "You probably don't want to look at this," as though it was something unsettling. The staff told the mother and girl that she was 19 weeks pregnant, and that they

couldn't do the abortion there. Instead, they said she must go to the Carhart clinic in Bellevue. He would do the abortion for \$1,900. The mother said the staff was insistent and had the phone handy, telling the girl she had to call "right now."

We don't always know when or how God uses us to turn people away from abortions. Once in a while, he gives us a sign of how important our presence is. How many more saves happen because we are there, only God knows. We can be encouraged by what former PP abortion clinic manager Abby Johnson has said more than once. The PP staff knows when people are outside praying on abortion days by the number of clients who don't show up or who change their minds and leave without having an abortion.
